



Air Transport Pilot Licence (ATPL) - Preparation Course and Flight Test

Overview

This course is for pilots who have:

- An Australian CASR Part 61 Commercial Pilot Licence (CPL) and require an Australian Air Transport Pilot Licence (ATPL).
- An overseas ATPL and require a conversion to an Australian ATPL.

The training focuses on the competencies required of a pilot-in-command of a multi-crew, multi-engine, turbine-engine aircraft in a CASR Part 135 air transport operation. Once the training is complete, Flight Options will conduct the ATPL Flight Test.

The preparation course and flight test is conducted in our Beechcraft King Air B200/BE350 Level D full flight simulator (FFS). Two pilots are scheduled for each course.

- General and aeronautical experience requirements are found in CASR Part 61.700 and 61.705
- Current Class 1 medical certificate
- MCC Certificate or multi-crew experience
- Multi-engine instrument rating
- Overseas ATPL holders should contact CASA to determine the specific training etc that you require
